# **Emily Finch - (**Returning Member) Board Vice President







## Fire Safety Field Trip


# Children Enjoy a Trip to the Kelseyville Fire Station, and Fire Safety Activities at the KRCA Clubhouse and Picnic Area

The real life of a firefighter was on full display for the students of the Kelseyville Riviera on a field trip to the Kelseyville Fire Station. Fire Prevention Officer Paul Bleuss, Captain Justin Helm, Firefighter Russell Rosenthal, and Firefighter Austin Yount treated the children to a tour of the fire station. They learned about the emergency vehicles and their various uses, the hoses, equipment and controls. Then students were treated to a hands-on experience, climbing into each of the emergency vehicles, followed by actually using the fire hose to knock down cones.









These skilled firefighters not only provided fire safety prevention information to the children, they also exhibited a natural talent for teaching young children.

The children were impressed by the training and skills involved in being a firefighter, including those needed to provide medical care. As we were getting ready to leave and Chief Bleuss was handing out stickers and fire safety bracelets, a real call came into the station over the radio. The children were in awe watching the firefighters head out to a real emergency - **perfect timing!** 

We then took a bus to the KRCA Clubhouse and enjoyed cupcakes while the children wrote thank you letters to the fire fighters. Words like brave, courage, and hero were repeatedly used as well as appreciation for saving and rescuing people.

The KRCA volunteers provided fire safety bags including activity books and magnets. We also held a raffle for orange and black backpacks with surprises including a flashlight. Children and volunteers had lunch together and the younger students enjoyed the picnic area.

### Fre Safeiv

As many of you are aware, there was a fire next to KRCA, the Harbor Fire (Marina area) in the afternoon of September 10th, 2024.

We do not know the official cause yet. Luckily, First Responders quickly arrived on the scene and were able to contain the fire spread, and put out the fire. Also, the winds were "in our favor" blowing towards the lake. We were extremely fortunate that First Responders crews and trucks were available to rapidly respond to this incident. The frightening incident should serve as a strong reminder to all members that we live in a very high fire hazard severity zone, as designated by Cal Fire. The fire could have spread quickly with a devastating impact on our entire community. This is why KRCA operates a year-round fire abatement and defensible space program to help homeowners be prepared in the event of fire. We would like to take

this moment to truly thank all KRCA members who have cooperated with the KRCA develop and maintain defensible space and fire safe landscaping on your properties. We recognize your hard work and financial commitment in doing so. Just to remind everyone, here are a few things you can do to stay fire safe as we enter the driest time of the year when the fire danger is at its peak.

- \* Weed-eat your properties early in the morning, before 10am and do not leave a hot weed eater, chainsaw, or lawn mower unattended.
- \* When doing yard work and property clearing, have water hoses or hand-held pump tanks filled with water nearby.
- \* Do not weed-eat or do any fire abatement work involving chain saws etc. on Red Flag Warning Days (these are extreme fire danger days when humidity is low, temperatures are high, the wind is blowing and conditions are dry).
- \* Sign up for app notifications on Lake Co Alerts, Genasys (formerly ZoneHaven) and Watch Duty.
- Consider having a portable radio or scanner in your car.
- \* Be ready to evacuate, have a Go Bag and Emergency Supply Kit ready and an evacuation plan in place.
- \* Maintain a list of emergency contact numbers in your cell phone, posted near your home phone, and in your Emergency Supply Kit.
- \* Ensure you and your family know where the home's gas, electric and water main shutoff controls are located and how to safely shut them down in an emergency. Also, with the increased grass and tree growth we are experiencing this year, please remember to cut your grasses, keep your gutters cleaned and trim back tree branches away from your roof and other structures. Together, let's make every effort to keep our KRCA community as fire safe as possible.

# Pest Alert! Mediterranean Oak Borer (MOB)



### **About the Beetle**

Mediterranean Oak Borer (MOB) is an invasive ambrosia beetle that targets oak species, putting our Blue Oak and Valley Oaks at risk. MOB attacks the crowns of the trees and works it's way down, eventually killing the tree, but can also enter through wounds.

#### Signs and Symptoms

- Browning of a limb while others on the tree look healthy
- White or light brown sawdust in bark crevices
- Black trellis-like tunnels under the bark (called galleries)







#### **Tips to Protect Your Oaks**


MOB enters the crown and works its way down, but can also enter through a wound. Sanitation pruning has been successful by pruning out dead limbs.

- Prune your oaks in Fall/Winter while dormant to minimize intrusion by beetles. (The beetles are also dormant at that time.)
- Photograph declining trees before leaves drop in fall to ensure contractors remove the correct limbs/trees.
- Burn or chip infested wood immediately to kill beetles and prevent the spread.
- · Cover chips with clear plastic to trap and kill beetles and solarize chips

#### Euphorbia plants are toxic and can cause severe consequences to humans:

<u>Sap:</u> The milky sap of euphorbia plants can irritate the skin and eyes, and can cause severe burning and blurred vision. **If left untreated, exposure to the sap can lead to blindness.**<u>Ingestion:</u> Ingesting parts of the euphorbia plant can cause nausea or vomiting. <u>Euphorbia cyparissias</u> contains chemicals that can cause cancer, burning in the mouth, vomiting, and diarrhea.

<u>Seeds:</u> The seeds of euphorbia berries are very poisonous, and just one can kill a child. <u>Photosensitivity:</u> Euphorbia sap can make skin photosensitive, causing blisters if handled with bare skin in the sun.

If you come into contact with euphorbia sap, you should immediately rinse the area with water. You should seek medical help if you experience: difficulty breathing, severe swelling, and intense gastrointestinal distress.

For less severe symptoms, such as a rash or mild stomach upset, you can call Poison Control at 1-800-222-1222. When seeking help, it's important to have the plant's name.




